the feat at the season-opening Ironman Tournament and will become the fastest Raider ever to 100 wins in terms of time. The RHS record for most wins, currently held by Cody Kelly (179) is in serious jeopardy.

Raiders Ready to Launch Silver Anniversary Season

What the Reynolds Raiders have accomplished through their first 49 seasons of wrestling is well documented. It's what is about to happen in season No. 50 that has the team, the coaches and the Reynolds Wrestling community so pumped.

Head Coach Brian Hills is as excited as anyone to get the Silver Anniversary edition of the Raiders on the mats.

"We've had a couple of very good scrimmages and the team is looking really good," Hills said. "I must say I have been pleasantly surprised by what I've seen. We haven't even started the season yet and I think I'm going to have to raise the bar a little bit already. So far, I've been very pleased. We're looking forward to getting out there and mixing it up a little."

It's easy to understand where Hills' excitement is coming from. His team enters the season on a roll. Reynolds has not lost a regular season dual match since 2004 - a span that covers 90 consecutive

Beckman and Adam Matthews and sophomore Dylan D'Urso - who placed in the top four at the state tournament.

"We've had a lot of great competition in our wrestling room already and I think that competition is going to drive this team to continue to improve as the season progresses," Hills predicted. "I really like this line-up.

Right now we have a good mix of veterans and younger kids ... it's a well-balanced lineup."

The Raiders' opening day lineup includes four seniors, three juniors, four sophomores and three freshmen.

Leading the senior class is team captain Luke Taylor, a two-time Northwest Regional qualifier who begins his final high school campaign with a 74-28

career record after going 35-10 as a junior. Taylor has been rock solid for the Raiders each of the last two seasons and looks to add to his impressive totals.

"Luke looks good ... real good," Hills said. "We look at him and see a potential state medalist. We think he can get to the medal stand."

Co-captain Gregg Baptiste will hold down the

starting spot at 171 pounds and with 72 career wins will have his sights set on the century mark. His presence will give the Raiders the experience they need to solidify the top portion of the lineup.

"It will be a disappointment if Gregg doesn't make it to states," Hills said bluntly. "He got hurt by what we thought was a bad call at regionals last year and probably deserved to go. He beat several kids throughout the year who placed at the state tournament." Rodney Harnett, who spent much of the 2008-09 season sidelined with an injury, looks to make the most of his senior year and will be the starter at 112. Though his 35-35 career record is modest, coach Hills sees

some big things for his slight senior.

"I think Rodney being able to make 112 pounds could end up being a real difference-maker for this team," Hills said. "He's an experienced kid who looks very strong at 112 pounds. We're glad he's in the line-up. He's worked hard for us throughout his career and overcome some adversity with injuries and such. I believe he's going to

"I see Mason really starting to mature," Hills said. "He's much more of a team guy this year ... he's turning into more of a leader. At practice he's been more vocal and active ... he jumps right in there and has been helping out showing some technique."

Adam Matthews, who showed tremendous improvement as a sophomore, battled all the way to a fourth-place showing at the state tournament and showcases a 68-24 career record. He will start the season at 130 pounds but will likely get used in multiple weight classes - especially in dual matches.

"I think Adam sort of see what's on the horizon for him," Hills said. "We're going to bump him around quite a bit in dual matches and he's probably going to end up with the tougher guy in most instances. I think he understands that and looks forward to the challenge."

Tyler Rhoades drops a weight class and begins his junior year at 160 after carding a 25-14 record last year at 171. "We've got a lot of confidence in Tyler," Hills said. "We know he is going to wrestle the tough guys tough and he's certainly going to win his share of matches. He'll be very competitive for us. We think he'll be even stronger at 160."

The only other junior on the roster is Eddy Nottingham (130) who earned a letter last season after going 7-3.

Dylan D'Urso won 44 of his 48 matches as a

freshman and has bumped up several weight classes, landing at 125 pounds after wrestling at 103 most of last season. He placed fourth at the PIAA Championships and is considered one of the Raiders' top young wrestlers.

Three other sophomores have also earned starting spots - Justin Rhodes, Matt Tofani and Blake Heim.

Rhodes (140) saw limited action as a freshman and earned a letter with a 5-4 record. He edged senior Babcock to earn the starting position.

Tofani has shown he is ready for prime time after forging an outstanding 15-3 junior varsity record a season ago. He beat back a challenge from talented freshman Cam Cianci to earn his starting spot. Another sophomore - Tyler Miller - is also a serious contender at 140.

Heim showed flashes of brilliance during his freshman campaign which ended with an overall record of 9-5. He will now be asked to step up and nail down the top of the lineup from his spot at 215 pounds.

Other sophomores include Tommy Davis (160), Steve Fisher (145) and Sam Napodano (160).

Pennsylvania Junior Wrestling state champion Austin Matthews heads a talented and deep freshman class which will make an immediate impact.

Matthews will start the season as the regular at 135 pounds but is certified to wrestle lower. He is the latest freshman phenom to come along and joins a growing list of Reynolds wrestlers to seek to make a big splash in their first varsity season.

"When I look at Austin I don't see a freshman," Hills said. "I see a seasoned veteran. He follows in the same molds as some of the better ones we've had come up through our program. He's a talented young man."

Two other freshmen - bookends Neal Engstrom (103) and Jamar Henry (285) - are also in the opening day lineup. Engstrom is the only Raider certified to wrestle at 103 so he will carry the entire load there, while Henry emerged the winner from a group of six wrestlers who auditioned for the heavyweight spot. Henry is a multiple PJW place-winner and a veteran of the Raiders elementary and junior high programs.

The remainder of the ninth grade class includes Curtis Arnold (112), Cody Kasbee (135), Matt Leise (130), Chris Nottingham (171), Tyler Ohl (171) and Logan Rickert (171).

"We understand that some of our younger guys may struggle a little bit, especially in December when our schedule is so tough. With the schedule we have a .500 record in the month of December is not that bad," Hills said.

NOTES: The Raiders open the season on Dec. 11-12 at the Ironman Tournament at Walsh-Jesuit High School in Cuyahoga Falls, OH. ... The first dual match is at home on Wednesday, Dec. 16 versus Erie McDowell. ... The Raiders will be able to fill 11 of 14 junior varsity weight classes, all except 103, 125 and 171. ... Napodano continues to recover from a life-threatening motocross accident about 18 months ago. He has received medical clearance to fully participate in wrestling this year and starts the season as the junior varsity 160-pounder.

Impossible to Overlook Beckman's December

In covering the Reynolds High School wrestling program, I have always made a conscious effort to put the accomplishments of the team before those of any individual.

With that said, what Mason Beckman accomplished in the first 30 days of the season simply cannot be ignored. I say this with confidence: If a Reynolds High School wrestler has ever had a better December than the one Beckman just completed then I'm not aware of it.

There are not enough adjectives to aptly describe what Beckman has done in the first few weeks of 2009-10. First, he reached 100 career wins, then on the same weekend he became just the second Raider to win the prestigious Asics Ironman tournament. Then it was a title at King of the Mountain tournament and more recently — because clearly that wasn't enough — it was a title, an Outstanding Wrestler award and a takedown record at the Manheim Lions Holiday Tournament.

There was a time when I thought an undefeated season was no longer possible for a RHS wrestler given the strength of the team's schedule. After documenting what Beckman has done in December, I have changed my mind. Yes, it's true, Mason Beckman has made me a flip-flopper. And did I mention, he's only a junior?

100 STRAIGHT WILL HAPPEN — I can honestly say that it was never a goal of anyone associated with the RHS wrestling program, but after the big win over Fort LeBoeuf on Dec. 21 it appears the Raiders are destined to win their 100th consecutive regular season dual match on Wednesday night Jan. 13 against Grove City (1990's Alumni Night).

The celebration will be short-lived however, as Hills & Co. travel to Brookville just two days later for the Johnson Motors Ultimate Duals where some of the top Class AA teams in the state — Brookville, Ridgway, Athens, Northern Lehigh and Burrell — will be waiting for the opportunity to become the team that snaps the streak. Reynolds' last regular season loss was at the Brookville Duals — in 2002-03 against eventual state champion Juniata. Since then, Reynolds has reeled off six straight unbeaten regular seasons.

NUMBERS FROM THE 00's — As we put up a new calendar for 2010 we close out the first decade of the new millennium. In looking at the numbers, we see that the 00's were kind to the Raiders. The team went 160-11 in dual matches, won three PIAA Dual Match championships and three PIAA team points titles. The Raiders were 128-4 in regular season duals and went unbeaten in 7 of the 10 seasons, including the last six straight.

Beckman Hammers Out Ironman Title

Taylor Finishes 8th at 145

Junior standout Mason Beckman battled his way through warrior after warrior en route to the 119-pound championship at the Asics Ironman Tournament which wrapped up Saturday, Dec. 12 at Walsh Jesuit High School in Cuyahoga Falls, OH.

Beckman, who won his 100th career match on the tourney's opening night, becomes just the second Reynolds wrestler to win an Ironman championship—joining Matt Dunn. Beckman's individual title helped spur the Raiders to 72 team points and a 13th place finish in the team standings. Ironman is considered one of the elite high school wrestling tournaments in the country.

"Mason came into the season at 98-12, so I think everyone knew what kind of competitor he already was," said Coach Brian Hills. "But the way he wrestled at Ironman was almost hard to put into words. He's just on a completely different level now."

Senior team captain Luke Taylor was stellar in placing 8th at 145 pounds. Taylor totaled a 4-3 weekend mark and was the only other Raider to place in the top eight.

"Luke really wrestled well," Hills added. "All of the kids Luke beat to get to 8th place were state-caliber wrestlers. That's the kind of tournament this is."

"I've come to the conclusion that Ironman is about getting the really good kids here. There were nearly 60 teams represented, but fewer and fewer teams are bringing their full line-up. The weight classes from top to bottom are so deep now. There are no weak entries at any weight. It's like only the very high quality kids are coming."

"That may hurt us a little bit, because we do bring our whole team. We have kids that go 0-2, but I still believe it is good for them to be exposed to this level of wrestling," Hills said. "As long as we come here we will always bring our full team. I don't ever want to get away from that *team* aspect."

No other Raider placed at the tournament though Dylan D'Urso (125), Adam Matthews (130), Austin Matthews (135) and Blake Heim (215) all won two matches to finish one match out of the money. Gregg Baptiste (171) and Rodney Harnett (112) also won bouts.

Beckman was dominating in securing his title. He outscored five tournament opponents by an aggregate 40-8 count, including a 7-1 romp in the semifinals and a 3-0 whitewashing in the finals over the nation's No. 2 ranked wrestler - Hunter Steiber of Monroeville, OH. Three of the wrestlers Beckman defeated at the event came into the tournament nationally ranked.

Corey Brown: Corey ('08) is coming off of an



He also set a new tournament record for most takedowns (38) breaking the record previously held by Easton's Jordan Oliver. It was the second Manheim title for Beckman, who posted a trio of technical falls and a major decision while running his season record to 16-0.

D'Urso also won his second

Manheim title, taking top honors at 125 pounds. He soared through his weight class without serious opposition, winning 6-3 in the finals.

For freshman Austin Matthews the tournament was a bit of a coming out party. He knocked off the No. 2 and No. 1 seeds on his way to the first major title of his young career. In the finals, he scored the winning points on a reversal with four seconds remaining. All three RHS champs are underclassmen.

Senior Luke Taylor (152) also advanced to the championship

Dual Meet Streak Reaches 100

Two of Northwest Pennsylvania's proudest wrestling programs butted heads in the final round of the 2010 Johnson Motors Ultimate Duals at Brookville High School and the result was a gut-wrenching, nail-biting, high-drama brawl that both squads walked away from feeling proud.

The Raiders (15-0) prevailed 33-27 by winning eight of the 14 bouts but it certainly wasn't a joy ride even though it was the 105th straight win for the Raiders.

"Overall, it was a good team effort," said Raider head coach Brian Hills.

"From my perspective, I think it was great for the kids to be in that kind of a match with that kind of pressure and that kind of drama—where every point became important. That's something you can't simulate in the practice room. I think that can only help us down the road."

Senior Rodney Harnett (112) and junior Mason Beckman (119) helped the Raiders erase a 27-22 deficit with two matches remaining by scoring a fall and technical fall, respectively.



Sophomore Dylan D'Urso (125) and freshman Austin Matthews (130) powered the Raiders to an impressive start with back-to-back tech falls. At 145 pounds, junior Adam Matthews wrestling with an injury that had held him out for more than three weeks, gutted out a 3-0 decision over Nate Harnish and Luke Taylor followed with a hard-fought 5-4 win over DJ Skraba.

Jeremy Fowler (189) and Blake Heim (215) added key wins in the upper weights with Heim needing overtime to get his win.

After the match, Heim was named the first wrestler to win the "Gilly Award," a prize named after former Brookville state champion Jason Gilligan



Standing in the way are the amazingly bullish Bisons of Fort LeBoeuf High School and first-year head coach Tim Simon. Greenville won the Region II title and Fort LeBoeuf was the Region III champion. Semifinal matches begin at 5 p.m.


All were league matches with the exception of Cambridge Springs.





Mason Beckman's Excellent Adventure

Mason Beckman became Reynolds High School's 22nd state champion at the 2010 PIAA Class AA Championships and in the process completed what is quite possibly the greatest single season in RHS wrestling history.

There have been other Raiders who have finished unbeaten, including Casey Taylor who did it twice, but none wrestled the intense schedule that Beckman did.

"I've gone on record as saying this is the best season ever by a Reynolds wrestler," said Coach Brian Hills. "I think when you look at everything, the toughness of the schedule and all that he has accomplished, that is the only logical conclusion to come to."

Beckman started the season with a bang, winning the nationally acclaimed Ironman Tournament. He followed that with a championship at Central Mountain's King of

the Mountain tournament and then was named the Outstanding Wrestler at the Manheim Tournament.

He rolled through the dual match portion of the schedule without being tested and was dominant at both the D-10 and PIAA duals.

Beckman stayed sharp in the post season, rolling to his third Section, District and Regional championships without breaking a sweat. Then at Hershey, he would not be denied.

He outscored his first three opponents 39-8 with a tech fall and a pair of major decisions and capped off his perfect season by pitching a 2-0 shutout over Benton's Mike Rhone in the finals.

Along the way, he set school records for most takedowns in a season (233) and most team points (311.5).

Even more impressive, Beckman did it all while maintaining a 4.0 grade point average. He recently scored 1260 on his SAT's and has already made a verbal commitment to attend Lehigh University where he will study business.

Four Raiders Earn Medals at State Tourney

Mason Beckman, Dylan D'Urso, Luke Taylor and Austin Mathews all returned home from the 2010 PIAA Wrestling Championships in Hershey with medals as the Raiders finished the season on a high note, placing fourth in the team standings.

Senior Greg Baptiste also qualified for the state tournament but did not place in the top eight.

Benton won the team title with 93 points and was followed by Shady Side Academy and Schuylkill Valley which tied for second with 64 points. Reynolds was fourth at 53.5 and Ridgway rounded out the top five with 48.5 points.

Beckman closed out his spectacular junior season with a gold medal at 119 pounds (see related story on page 3). It is his first state championship but his third PIAA medal, after placing second as a freshman and third as a sophomore. Beckman fin-

ished his season with a record of 49-0 and is 147-12 in his high school career.

Sophomore Dylan D'Urso wrestled one of the best tournaments of his young career and

Taylor, the Raiders team captain, had a fall and major decision before falling in the 145 pound finals; and Baptiste, the co-captain, posted a 3-1 tourney mark, losing only to the Regional champion while scoring a fall in his third place final.

Fort LeBoeuf Nips Raiders in All-D10 State Final Raiders Finish Second to Extend Streak of Hershey Success

At first thought, having two District 10 teams battling it out in the state finals match was pretty exciting, but as the PIAA Class AA title match between Reynolds

and Fort Le-Boeuf began to take shape, it somehow began to lose its luster. Things were happening that weren't supposed to be happening.

There was an "Erie" feeling surrounding the match.

In the end, it was the Bisons of Fort LeBoeuf that did what they had to do to win their first ever state championship — edging the Raiders 32-29. In winning the title, Fort LeBoeuf became the only other D-10 team besides Reynolds to win a PIAA Dual Match championship.

For Reynolds, it is a silver medal that marks the team's sixth straight year of placing in the top three.

"I hate second place," admitted Reynolds coach Brian Hills. "But I have to give Fort LeBoeuf a lot of credit. They came out here today and beat us. They won the matchups that they had to win."

"They had a great run through the postseason," Hills added, "and they were able to finish it off."

The key for Fort LeBoeuf was being able to gain bonus points. To their credit, they earned a trio of falls and a major decision over Reynolds wrestlers. That's something no other team has been able to pull off against the Raiders in a long, long time.

For Reynolds, Mason Beckman (119) and Luke Taylor (145) countered with falls and Rodney Harnett (112) and Dylan D'Urso (125) added major decisions.

In the last six years, Reynolds has placed second, first, first, third, first and second. Not a bad run.

"Obviously, we did not come down here to finish second, so in that respect I am disappointed," Hills said. "But this team is young, with seven freshman and sophomore starters. Some of that inexperience showed today. But, we'll bounce back and get ready for the postseason. There are still things we want to accomplish."



Impossible to Overlook Beckman's December

In covering the Reynolds High School wrestling program, I have always made a conscious effort to put the accomplishments of the team before those of any individual.

With that said, what Mason Beckman accomplished in the first 30 days of the season simply cannot be ignored. I say this with confidence: If a Reynolds High School wrestler has ever had a better December than the one Beckman just completed then I'm not aware of it.

There are not enough adjectives to aptly describe what Beckman has done in the first few weeks of 2009-10. First, he reached 100 career wins, then on the same weekend he became just the second Raider to win the prestigious Asics Ironman tournament. Then it was a title at King of the Mountain tournament and more recently — because clearly that wasn't enough — it was a title, an Outstanding Wrestler award and a takedown record at the Manheim Lions Holiday Tournament.

There was a time when I thought an undefeated season was no longer possible for a RHS wrestler given the strength of the team's schedule. After documenting what Beckman has done in December, I have changed my mind. Yes, it's true, Mason Beckman has made me a flip-flopper. And did I mention, he's only a junior?

100 STRAIGHT WILL HAPPEN — I can honestly say that it was never a goal of anyone associated with the RHS wrestling program, but after the big win over Fort LeBoeuf on Dec. 21 it appears the Raiders are destined to win their 100th consecutive regular season dual match on Wednesday night Jan. 13 against Grove City (1990's Alumni Night).

The celebration will be short-lived however, as Hills & Co. travel to Brookville just two days later for the Johnson Motors Ultimate Duals where some of the top Class AA teams in the state — Brookville, Ridgway, Athens, Northern Lehigh and Burrell — will be waiting for the opportunity to become the team that snaps the streak. Reynolds' last regular season loss was at the Brookville Duals — in 2002-03 against eventual state champion Juniata. Since then, Reynolds has reeled off six straight unbeaten regular seasons.

NUMBERS FROM THE 00's — As we put up a new calendar for 2010 we close out the first decade of the new millennium. In looking at the numbers, we see that the 00's were kind to the Raiders. The team went 160-11 in dual matches, won three PIAA Dual Match championships and three PIAA team points titles. The Raiders were 128-4 in regular season duals and went unbeaten in 7 of the 10 seasons, including the last six straight.

Beckman Hammers Out Ironman Title

Taylor Finishes 8th at 145

Junior standout Mason Beckman battled his way through warrior after warrior en route to the 119-pound championship at the Asics Ironman Tournament which wrapped up Saturday, Dec. 12 at Walsh Jesuit High School in Cuyahoga Falls, OH.

Beckman, who won his 100th career match on the tourney's opening night, becomes just the second Reynolds wrestler to win an Ironman championship—joining Matt Dunn. Beckman's individual title helped spur the Raiders to 72 team points and a 13th place finish in the team standings. Ironman is considered one of the elite high school wrestling tournaments in the country.

"Mason came into the season at 98-12, so I think everyone knew what kind of competitor he already was," said Coach Brian Hills. "But the way he wrestled at Ironman was almost hard to put into words. He's just on a completely different level now."

Senior team captain Luke Taylor was stellar in placing 8th at 145 pounds. Taylor totaled a 4-3 weekend mark and was the only other Raider to place in the top eight.

"Luke really wrestled well," Hills added. "All of the kids Luke beat to get to 8th place were state-caliber wrestlers. That's the kind of tournament this is."

"I've come to the conclusion that Ironman is about getting the really good kids here. There were nearly 60 teams represented, but fewer and fewer teams are bringing their full line-up. The weight classes from top to bottom are so deep now. There are no weak entries at any weight. It's like only the very high quality kids are coming."

"That may hurt us a little bit, because we do bring our whole team. We have kids that go 0-2, but I still believe it is good for them to be exposed to this level of wrestling," Hills said. "As long as we come here we will always bring our full team. I don't ever want to get away from that *team* aspect."

No other Raider placed at the tournament though Dylan D'Urso (125), Adam Matthews (130), Austin Matthews (135) and Blake Heim (215) all won two matches to finish one match out of the money. Gregg Baptiste (171) and Rodney Harnett (112) also won bouts.

Beckman was dominating in securing his title. He outscored five tournament opponents by an aggregate 40-8 count, including a 7-1 romp in the semifinals and a 3-0 whitewashing in the finals over the nation's No. 2 ranked wrestler - Hunter Steiber of Monroeville, OH. Three of the wrestlers Beckman defeated at the event came into the tournament nationally ranked.

Finding his team trailing by three points after seven weight classes, head coach Brian Hills enacted the 2009-10 Reynolds Wrestling Recovery Program and his Raiders responded to the stimulus in a big way, scoring a 39-23 win over visiting Fort LeBoeuf on Tuesday, Dec. 22.

Corey Brown: Corey ('08) is coming off of an





The Reynolds junior varsity wrestling team had the opportunity to compete in a pair of tournaments this season.

The Youngsville tournament took place in Dec. and was followed by the third annual Reynolds VFW Junior Varsity Tournament on Jan. 2.

The following is a breakdown of how the Reynolds jayvee wrestlers did at those events:

Matt Leise: Wrestling at 130 pounds, Matt posted a 6-2 overall record while placing third at both the Youngsville and Reynolds VFW tournaments. Matt was 3-1 at both events.

Raiders Gunning for Sixth Straight Duals Title

The undefeated Reynolds Raiders have been named the top seed and will aim to win their sixth straight title at the District 10 Class AA Dual Match Championships on Thursday, Feb. 4 at Edinboro University of Pa. Reynolds has won eight of the last nine D-10 duals championships.

The Raiders (17-0) recently wrapped up their seventh straight unbeaten regular season and is led by veteran head coach Brian Hills who looks to reach a personal milestone in a semifinal match-up against Saegertown. Coach Hills enters the tournament with an all-time mark of 349-33-1.

In 11 previous D-10 appearances, Reynolds boasts a won-loss record of 19-3 and has won eight titles and finished second on three other occasions. The Raiders have never lost a first round match.

"When you get to the District level, things begin to change a little bit," Hills said. "Each individual match matters. Bonus points matter. You can't give up anything and you have to be able to capitalize and make the most of opportunities when they are given to you."

Region I champion Reynolds is a heavy favorite over the Panthers and their mat boss Jim Mulligan, one of D-10's most colorful coaches. Even though Saegertown is 6-1, they suffered a humbling 50-10 loss to No. 3

seed Fort LeBoeuf, a team that Reynolds has already beaten this season. In last season's semifinals Reynolds overwhelmed Saegertown 63-3.

The other side of the Class AA bracket features a compelling match-up between No. 2 seed Greenville and No. 3 seed Fort LeBoeuf.

Greenville coach John Reynolds led his team to the PIAA semifinals in 2007 and would like nothing more than to take his squad back to Hershey. Standing in the way are the amazingly bullish Bisons of Fort LeBoeuf High School and first-year head coach Tim Simon. Greenville won the Region II title and Fort LeBoeuf was the Region III champion. Semifinal matches begin at 5 p.m.



Mason Beckman became Reynolds High School's 22nd state champion at the 2010 PIAA Class AA Championships and in the process completed what is quite possibly the greatest single season in RHS wrestling history.

There have been other Raiders who have finished unbeaten, including Casey Taylor who did it twice, but none wrestled the intense schedule that Beckman did.

"I've gone on record as saying this is the best season ever by a Reynolds wrestler," said Coach Brian Hills. "I think when you look at everything, the toughness of the schedule and all that he has accomplished, that is the only logical conclusion to come to."

Beckman started the season with a bang, winning the nationally acclaimed Ironman Tournament. He followed that with a championship at Central Mountain's King of

the Mountain tournament and then was named the Outstanding Wrestler at the Manheim Tournament.

He rolled through the dual match portion of the schedule without being tested and was dominant at both the D-10 and PIAA duals.

Beckman stayed sharp in the post season, rolling to his third Section, District and Regional championships without breaking a sweat. Then at Hershey, he would not be denied.

He outscored his first three opponents 39-8 with a tech fall and a pair of major decisions and capped off his perfect season by pitching a 2-0 shutout over Benton's Mike Rhone in the finals.

Along the way, he set school records for most takedowns in a season (233) and most team points (311.5).

Even more impressive, Beckman did it all while maintaining a 4.0 grade point average. He recently scored 1260 on his SAT's and has already made a verbal commitment to attend Lehigh University where he will study business.

With all these tremendous accomplishments, it's easy to forget ... he's only a junior.

Four Raiders Earn Medals at State Tourney

Mason Beckman, Dylan D'Urso, Luke Taylor and Austin Mathews all returned home from the 2010 PIAA Wrestling Championships in Hershey with medals as the Raiders finished the season on a high note, placing fourth in the team standings.
