Change Brings Opportunity

Across Pennsylvania, there were two significant changes during the off-season that will have an impact on the coming season.

First, the PIAA Individual Wrestling Championships have expanded to a 20-man bracket. That means the Northwest Regional will gain an additional state qualifier in each weight class.

Last year, Reynolds qualified seven wrestlers for the state tournament (eight when Austin Moffett was later added due to an injured wrestler). Under the new system, the Raiders would have taken nine and seniors Moffett and Mason McCollum would have advanced based on their fourth-place finishes.

While some would argue that this new system “waters down” the state tournament, I believe it creates opportunity for wrestlers who are willing to put in the work.

Furthermore, I don’t think it’s a stretch to say that becoming a state qualifier should be the goal for every wrestler on this roster. For some it may not be this year, but the opportunity is there for those willing to work for the prize.

The other big story across Pennsylvania is that Bethlehem Catholic—the team that beat Reynolds in the dual match state

finals the last two years—has opted to move up to Class AAA.

It was a big story across the state, and created a lot of talk, but it won’t have the kind of direct impact on most teams that it will on Reynolds.



In the 16-year history of the state duals, the Raiders have been a perennial contender, placing in the Top 3 eight times, while winning a trio of titles. Bethlehem Catholic has been the biggest obstacle to winning a state title in recent years and with them removed from the equation it provides a real opportunity for RHS.

As we begin the season, I believe Reynolds is one of the top three or four AA teams in the state. Come February, the Raiders will show us exactly where they stand in that hierarchy—and without Bethlehem Catholic to contend with, it should be fun.

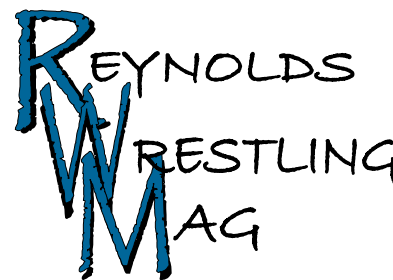
UPCOMING MILESTONES— A couple of milestones will come early in the season.

It won’t take long for senior Mike Bartolo (94) to reach his 100th career win or for the team to chalk up its 750th dual match

win.

Reynolds enters the season with an intimidating dual-match record of 746-87-2 and win No. 750 will almost certainly come in early December.

Besides Bartolo, three other Raiders could also reach 100 career wins this season. Gene Ringler has 72 wins, Seth Hogue is at 68 and Mike Millero has 63.

Built for Success

Raiders Anchored by 6 Returning State Qualifiers

The fact that nearly half of the projected starting lineup has wrestled at the state tournament has caused a heightened level of excitement to rumble through Raider Nation this preseason. It's almost like the ground is trembling as we prepare for this team to lift off.

But even with all that anticipation - and expectation - the best news of all is that this team remains quite young as only two of the team's six returning state qualifiers are seniors. In addition to the half dozen state qualifiers, Reynolds also lists nine returning letter-winners who have combined to win 15 emblems.

As a team, Reynolds has wrestled in the state finals the last two seasons and last year sent eight wrestlers to the PIAA individual championships. Repeating those accomplishments, dare we say improving upon them, is the focus of Raiders Coach Casey Taylor.

"We feel good about where this program is at and where it is going," said Taylor. "We have a real solid senior class - maybe one that is getting overlooked a little bit - that is providing the leadership that is needed, and a real nice nucleus of returning starters. Add to that,

another outstanding freshman class and you can see why we are excited to get this season started.”

In anticipation of the opening of the 2014-15 season, here is a look at all 14 weight classes and the individual contenders at each.

The battle for the starting spot at 106 pounds looks to be one of the most competitive on the team as talented freshmen Ryan Harnett and Noah Fuchs go head to head. Harnett has an advantage in size and strength but Fuchs is every bit as talented. An early-season injury to Fuchs has affected his ability to compete, so look for Harnett to open the season as the starter and for Fuchs to turn up the heat as he returns to full strength.

A third freshman, Tylir Shannon has until the first competition to decide if he will stay up with the varsity or wrestle a junior high schedule. If he stays up with the varsity, he will provide some much needed depth and insurance in the lower weight classes.

State qualifier Gage Bayless will be the starter at 113 pounds. Bayless had an outstanding freshman season while winning Manheim, Section and District 10 crowns. He also won a match at the state tournament and finished the year with an impressive 39-7 record.

Cole Matthews, one the most highly-decorated junior wrestlers in Reynolds history, will be the starter at 120. Matthews has won multiple national and

state championships and is considered one of the most talented freshmen in all of Pennsylvania. He is, of course, the younger brother of Austin and Adam Matthews, who combined to win 315 matches at RHS.

“Cole is a very talented young man and just a tremendous competitor,” Taylor said. “We expect him to jump right in there and make an immediate impact. We love knowing he is going to be a Raider for the next four years.”

There is a bit of a talent log-jam at 126 pounds where junior Seth Hogue, sophomore Chaise Hauck, junior Alec Reiter and freshman Hunter Michaels are all viable candidates.

Hogue, who placed fourth at the PIAA Championships last season, would appear to be a likely starter with Hauck or one of the others moving up and starting at 132 pounds.

“It’s a good problem to have,” Taylor said. “There is a lot of talent in that group of young men right there. As they begin to mature and spread out a little bit, we see all of these guys as having the ability to help this team win matches.”

Senior Mike Bartolo could drop to 132 pounds as the season advances, but look for him to start at 138 pounds. Bartolo is a two-time state qualifier who recently signed to wrestle for Division II Seton Hill University. He enters his senior season with a 94-31 career record and will be counted on to be the ham-

mer in the middle of the lineup.

"By signing before the season, Mike has succeeded in taking a lot of pressure off his shoulders," Taylor said. "Deciding which college to attend is a big decision; and with that having been settled our hope is that Mike can really focus in on reaching his personal goals."

There will be plenty of competition for the starting spots at 145, 152 and 160 pounds. Among the candidates for those three spots will be seniors James Slater and Nick Nottingham, junior Daniel Blayney, sophomores Joel Leise, Brik Bateman, Andrew Osborne, Damien Gearhart and Ben Wilcox, and freshmen Ryan Park and Matthew Gosser.

"That depth we have in the middle of the lineup really is one of the true strengths of this year's team," Taylor said. "This is my fourth year as head coach and this year's team has by far the most depth of any of the four. There will be battles in our room every day by kids who are hungry to earn a starting position at those three weights."

"All of these kids have talent and a real desire to excel," Taylor said. "It's going to be fun watching how all of that shakes out over the course of the season. The bottom line is that we will be prepared to go to battle with whoever emerges from that group."

Of that long list of candidates, Leise is a returning starter and Nottingham also has considerable varsity experience as well as a .500 career record. Slater and Gearhart have limited varsity experience.

Leise will start the season on injured reserve after suffering an injury late in the football season. He is expected to miss all of December but should be ready to go at some point in January.

"We'll miss Joel in the starting lineup, no doubt about that," Taylor said. "The upside of Joel's injury is that some of these less-experienced guys will get an opportunity to get in there and get some mat time, and we'll be a better team for it in the long run."

"Joel is a tough kid. He doesn't like being on the sidelines, I can tell you that," Taylor added. "He continues to impress me every day with the amount of work he puts into his rehab. He has really grown physi-

cally since last season, he's gotten much stronger and we look for big things from him once he gets back to 100 percent."

As we move up the lineup to 170 pounds, we find another of the Raiders returning state qualifiers in senior Mike Millero. He went 1-2 at the state tournament last year and just missed out on all-state honors. Millero has been elected by his teammates as this year's team captain.

"We're confident that Mike will be able to provide that consistent leadership that we look for from our senior captain," Taylor said, adding, "Mike is a hard-working kid who got a taste of post-season success last year. You can see the desire in him that he wants more and the coaching staff wants more for him."

Sophomore Jared Uhrin, who opted not to wrestle last season, is back on the team and is penciled in as the starter at 182.

"We've been pleasantly surprised by Jared," Taylor said. "I'm really happy with the progress that he has shown." Uhrin had an above-average junior career and will be counted on to fill what would have otherwise been a gaping hole in the RHS lineup.

A pair of seniors will duke it out for the starting spot at 195 pounds. Jake Stoyer will be the starter to open

the season but will be pushed by classmate Ryan Zeronas who is working hard to whittle a few pounds off his frame. Stoyer, who won his only varsity match last season, was elected the team's co-captain. He and Millero were also captains of the RHS football team.

Senior Brandon Davis and freshman Jarod Miller will be the backups in the 182-195 pound weight classes.

The Raiders will be as good as any team in Pennsylvania at 220 and 285 as sophomore Cole Rickert and junior Gene Ringer provide RHS with a thunderous one-two punch at the top of the lineup.

As a freshman, Rickert crashed the starting lineup in mid-December and never looked back, rolling all the way to a 220-pound Regional championship. He won 31 matches and was one win short of all-state honors.

Last season, Ringer became the first Reynolds sophomore heavyweight to earn a PIAA medal. That is truly an impressive feat, considering the long list of talented Reynolds heavyweights that have gone before him including names like Coryea, Kress, Brandt, Armer, Tofani, Gentile, and Edwards.

"We believe that Gene has the ability to do some very special things," Taylor said. "If he stays focused and continues to work hard, we're confident that he will get to where he wants to go."

Junior Zach Huffman and sophomore Michael Huffman will be backups for the Raiders in the upper-weights.

Taylor reports that he is happy with the progress that his team is making in pre-season drills. As for team goals, Taylor said his squad is focused on "... get-

ting healthy, and setting our sights on two trips to Hershey. I firmly believe that this year's team can compete for a state title." Early indicators show that his squad is right on schedule.

"Typically, with the amount of youth that we have on this year's team the first two weeks would have been spent covering basic technique. However, this group has been involved in the sport for quite a few years which allows us as a team to push harder and focus on our first competitions," Taylor said.

Meanwhile, Reynolds continues to tinker with its regular season schedule (see schedule, page 9). RHS has dropped the Manheim Tournament and the Region I Mega Duals were cancelled. In their place, the team has added the Powerade Tournament and Canfield, OH duals. Included in the list of five teams the Raiders are slated to face Dec. 20 in Canfield, is St. Paris Graham, a team that is currently ranked sixth in the country.

Joining Taylor and rounding out the varsity coaching staff are Joe Reichard, Marty Taylor, Adam Matthews, Jay Pierce, Logan Rickert and Jeff Linn.

Making the Grade

Nationally Ranked Beckman, Matthews Lead 8 Raiders at Collegiate Level

It's hard to believe that wrestling season is here again already, but the college season is off and running in a big time way.

Lehigh's returning All-American **Mason Beckman ('11)** got the season started more than a month ago as he was selected to compete in the NWCA All-Star Classic for a second straight year. Once again, Edinboro's AJ Schopp was his opponent for the exhibition. Their bout was voted to be the showcase match for the event and was saved for last. Beckman, who was ranked No. 2 in the preseason national rankings, opened the scoring by taking down the top ranked Schopp. But, Schopp picked up his own takedown late in the final period and added a riding time point for a 4-2 decision.

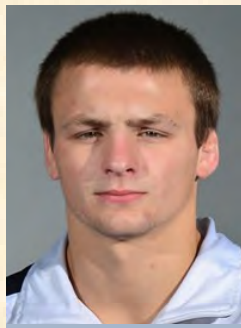

Mason didn't have to wait long to get back on the mat, as he scored a win in Lehigh's dual victory over Hofstra five days later. Lehigh then traveled to Penn State to battle the fifth ranked Nittany Lions. Beckman suffered an upset loss to Jimmy Gulibon and Lehigh fell in the dual, 24-10.

Mason has responded well since, winning each individual match and leading Lehigh to four straight dual wins including upsetting #11 Pitt, and defeating #13 Illinois and #17 Northwestern. Mason's season record is 5-1 and he's currently ranked sixth at 133 pounds. Lehigh has climbed to #11 in the team rankings. Lehigh's remaining December schedule is: vs. Penn 12/6; vs #22 Rider 12/7; vs Princeton and #14 Edinboro at the Grapple at the Garden in New York City 12/21.

Returning national qualifier **Austin Matthews ('13)** opted for a change of scenery as he transferred from Clarion to Edinboro during the off-season. The change has seems to agree with him as he is off to an unbeaten start. Austin opened the sea-

son by returning to Clarion for the Eagles' Open tournament and he dominated the field en route to the 157 pound crown. He went 5-0 with two falls and two major decisions, including a 9-0 trouncing of Cal-Poly's Colt Shorts in the finals. He then shook off a slow start at the Pitt dual to defeat Ronnie Garbinsky by scoring a four-point move in the match's final seconds. Austin had an impressive weekend at the Eastern Michigan Duals, as he defeated two higher ranked wrestlers - blanking #8 Luke Smith of Central Michigan and outlasting #10 Brian Murphy 8-6. The win over Murphy helped Edinboro upset #8 Michigan 23-16.

Matthews also defeated Andrew Morse of Northern Illinois, 8-0. Austin is currently 9-0 on the season and has climbed to #8 in the national rankings. Edinboro's remaining December schedule is: vs. Cleveland State 12/4; the PSAC championships in Bloomsburg 12/6; vs. Clarion 12/13; vs Cornell and #11 Lehigh at the Grapple in the Garden in New York City 12/21.

Mercyhurst's returning Division II All-American **Dylan D'Urso ('12)** will be hitting the open tournament trail, as he will be red-shirting this season. Dylan finished 4th at the Laker Open, winning his first two matches, before dropping his semifinal contest to Clarion's Brock Zacherl 6-3. He then won in the consy semis before forfeiting to his teammate in the consolation finals. Unfortunately, D'Urso suffered an injury in his opening bout of the East Stroudsburg Open and has not returned to action since.

Mason McCollum ('14) is also on the Mercyhurst roster. He is backing up returning national qualifier Francis Mizia at 157 pounds. Mason picked up his first collegiate win in the consolations at the Laker open. He also wrestled at the East Stroudsburg Open, dropping decisions to DI wrestlers from Navy and Bucknell.

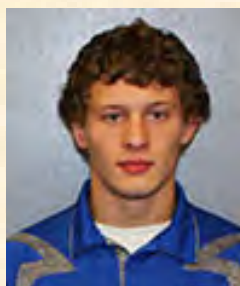
McCollum turned in his finest performance of the season, to date, at the Simonson Open at Ashland University by posting a 2-2 record. One of those wins came against the No. 5 seed. Mercyhurst will compete at the PSAC Championships in Bloomsburg on 12/6 and travel to Seton Hill on 12/18.

Speaking of Seton Hill, **Levi Stoyer ('14)** has matriculated there and is competing at 157 pounds. He lost a close decision in his first collegiate bout at the Washington & Jefferson Open, but battled back to win three straight matches before being eliminated from the event. He then had a very impressive showing at the Mount Union Invitational, advancing all the way to the semifinals before finishing in sixth place. His record is currently 5-5. Seton Hill finishes December by going to Bloomsburg for the PSAC Championships on 12/6 and then hosting Mercyhurst on 12/18.

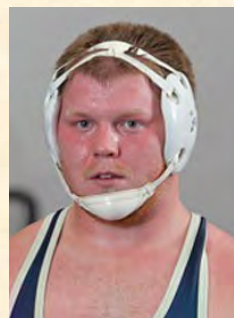
After not competing last season, **Adam Matthews ('11)** is back on the mat for Thiel College. His first competition was in a dual against Mt. Union where he knocked off Bryant Robie 7-3 helping Thiel pull off the upset. Mount Union was ranked 11th in the nation and Robie was listed as a national contender in the D3 rankings. Adam picked up three straight wins, including two pins at the Mt. Union Invitational to advance to the 141 pound semifinals, where he lost a 2-1 decision in the tie-breaker period to the tournament's eventual champion. Unfortunately, Matthews suffered a broken collarbone in that match and had to default to 6th place. He will be sidelined indefinitely. During his down time he will continue to be a part-time assistant coach with the Raiders.

Blake Heim ('12) is the starting heavyweight for Thiel College. Heim finished just shy of placing at the Washington & Jefferson Invitational, winning three matches. He was also instrumental in helping pull off the upset against Mt. Union as he was a 2-1 winner in overtime. Blake then won both his

bouts at the Mt. Union Duals helping Thiel defeat John Carroll and Lycoming. Heim is 6-1 on the season and is listed as honorable mention in the national rankings. Thiel is ranked 14th as a team. They close out their December schedule at the RIT Invitational 12/6.

Jamar Henry ('13) is up to 197 for his sophomore season after wrestling 184 last year for Mercyhurst North East. He started the season with two dual wins against Niagara County Community College and Jamestown Community College. He then went 3-2, garnering a 5th place finish at the Simonson Open. He advanced all the way to the semifinals before dropping a tough 2-0 decision to Ashland's Branden O'Neill. His wins included an upset of Trevor Beiter of Gannon, the tournament's No. 3 seed. Jamar is 5-2 this season. MNE will travel to Niagara CCC for duals on 12/5 and an open 12/6, then to the Cleveland State Open on 12/13.

Clint Morrison, the son of **Tim Morrison ('78)**, joined Mason Beckman Philadelphia as he was invited to participate in a showcase match that preceded the NWCA All-Star Classic. Morrison lost by technical fall to Lorenzo Thomas of Penn, but significantly closed that gap, as he recently took Thomas to overtime before dropping a 5-3 decision. Clint is 3-2 for Rider, which travels to Lehigh 12/7 and closes December at the Midlands on 12/29.

In other news involving Reynolds alumni, **Will Ringer ('09)** is back for his second season as a graduate assistant coach for Doane College in Nebraska. **Corey Brown ('08)** is not a part of Thiel's coaching staff after being an assistant for the past two seasons. Brown accepted a position at Roger Williams as Coordinator of Residence Education. **Chris Osborne ('84)** has been named the District 10 Wrestling Chairman, replacing Jack McIntire who died in June. In this position, Chris will oversee high school wrestling in all of District 10.

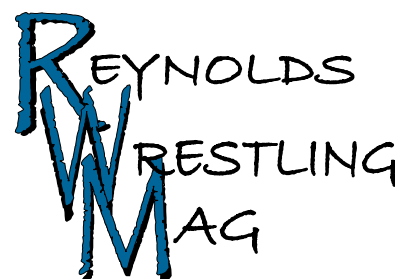

Raiders Extend Win Streak Over GHS

The Reynolds Raiders won the first seven matches, jumping out to a 32-0 advantage in extending its win streak over rival Greenville to 17 straight with a 48-21 triumph Thursday, Dec. 11 at Thiel College.

Reynolds (2-0) was dominant in winning 10 of the 14 individual matches while improving its all-time series lead over the Trojans

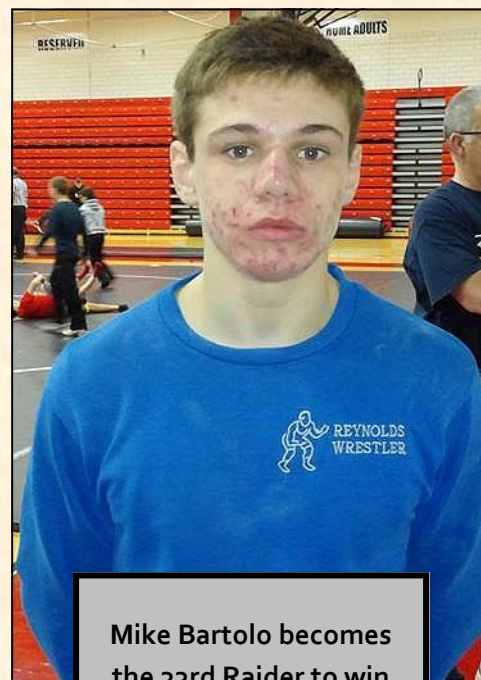

After scoring wins in duals against Penn and Rider, Beckman scored his first bonus points of the season with a tech fall against Princeton. Then, in a re-match of the NWCA All-Star meet, Mason faced Edinboro's top ranked AJ Schopp. Schopp was able to make the match's only takedown stand up in a 3-1 decision.

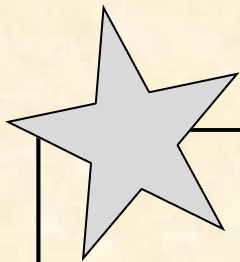

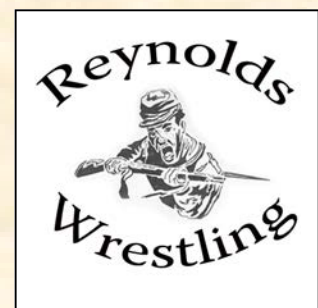

Foxcatcher: Deep, Dark and Disturbing

I've never written a movie review before, but that's not going to stop me from giving it a rip.

Foxcatcher is a complex movie that even now, weeks after having seen it, still has me grappling to figure out what it means.

You should know going in that Foxcatcher is not a movie that's going to make you feel good. It's not funny, it's not light, and it almost certainly will not "entertain" you. You're not going to walk away saying, "I really enjoyed that." At least I didn't.

Yet, somehow, despite all the darkness that surrounds the film, I'm still glad I saw it.

If you're reading this column, then you are no doubt a fan of the sport. And if you are a fan of wrestling then this is a story you should know. Maybe you weren't around or paying attention when Dave Schultz was murdered in 1996, but the events of that cold January day still resonate through our sport. This movie reflects a painful part of wrestling's past. A dark chapter,

but nonetheless an important chapter.

I recommend that you see the movie, but be prepared for a sobering experience. And don't make the



mistake of confusing it for a "wrestling movie" because it's really not that either.

Finally, I would caution parents of younger children that there are scenes that involve drug use, overtones of homosexuality, as well as cold-blooded murder. So use caution in who watches it with you and who doesn't.

After seeing the movie I later learned that there is a Reynolds connection — as first-year assistant coach Jeff Linn played a small role in the movie.

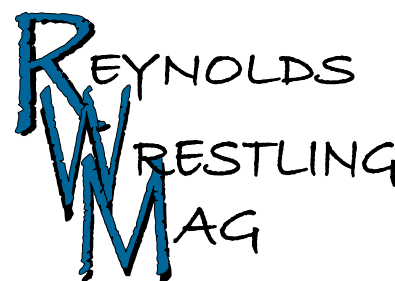

Jim Mulligan were perfect in their region, as well.

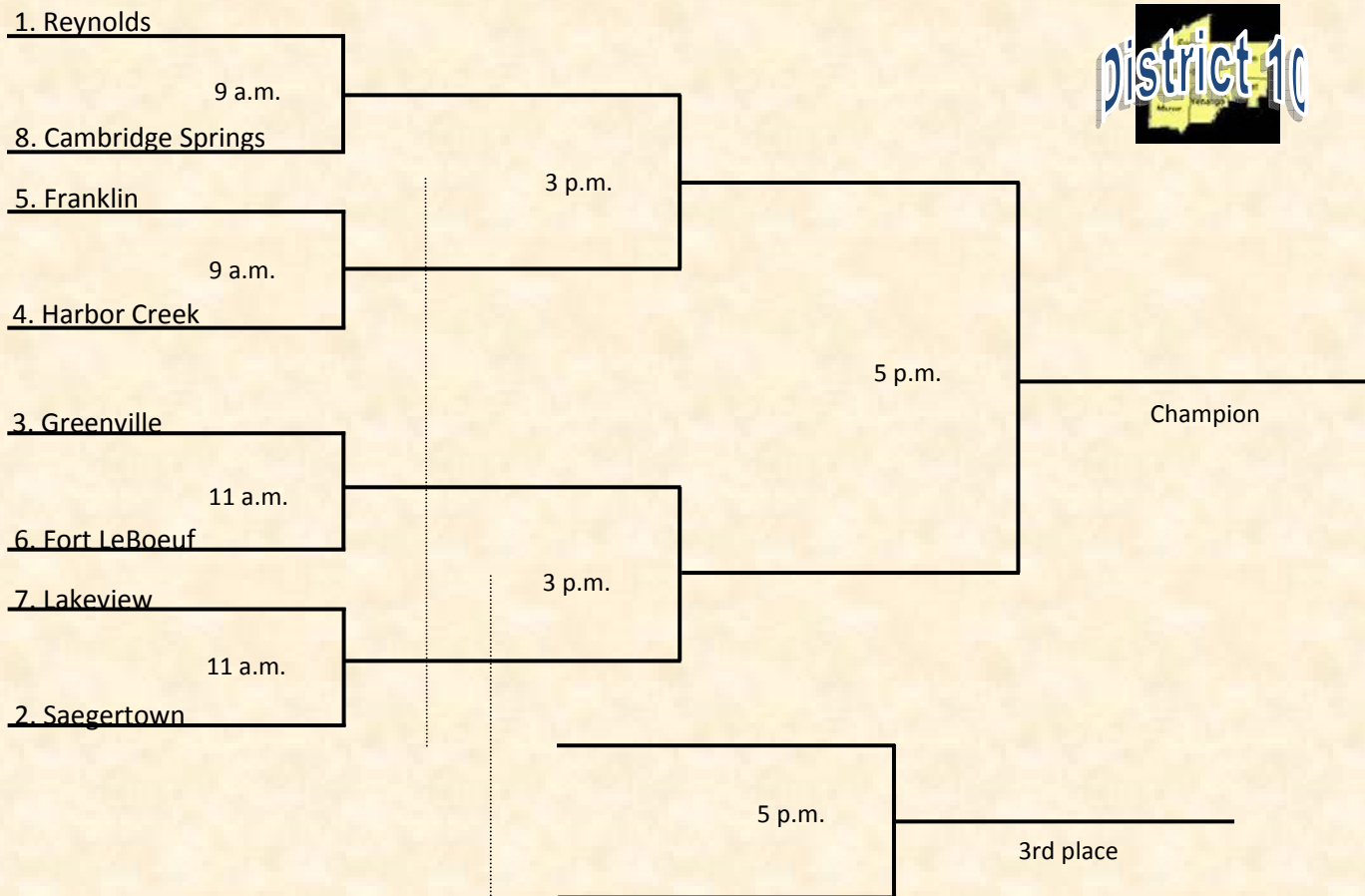
Greenville is the No. 3 seed and is the champion out of Region II. The Trojans of Coach John Reynolds were not seriously tested by any of their Region II opponents.

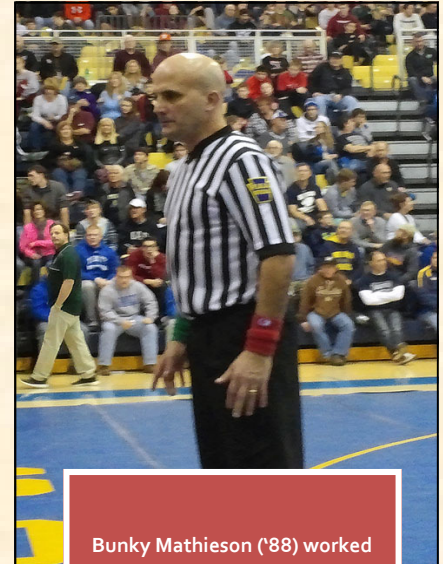

The match also marked the return of Joel Leise (160) who returned to the mat for the first time this season after suffering an injury late in the football season.

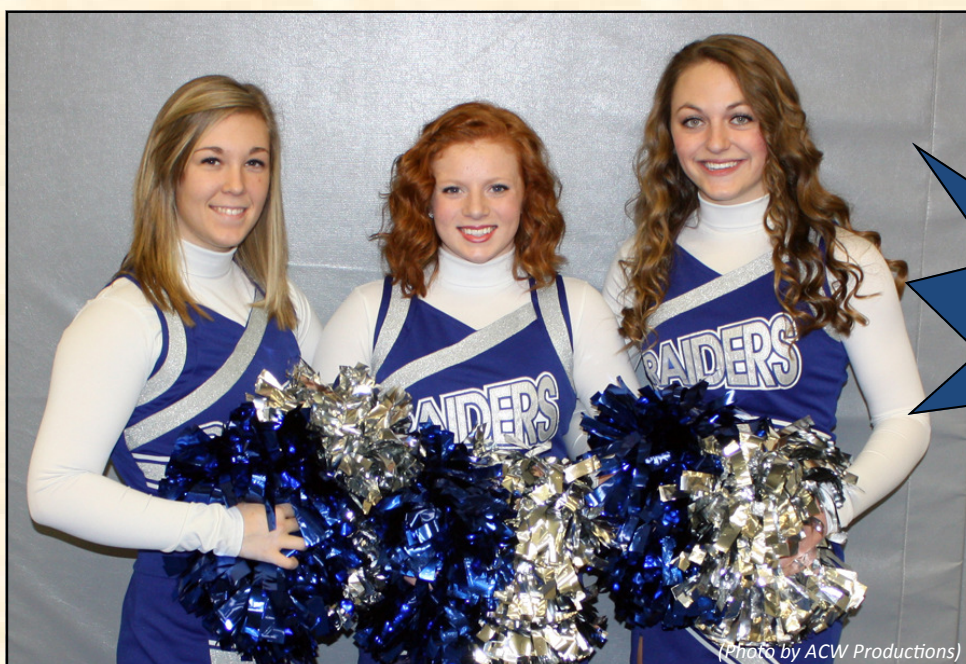

Freshman Ryan Harnett was solid all year and showed that even if Fuchs had been healthy that he would have had a real battle on his hands.

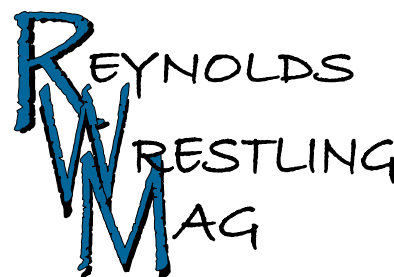

Mike Bartolo helped, so did Nottingham, Zeronas and Slater. Brandon Davis, the only other senior, stepped into the program as a first-year wrestler and won the challenge by finishing out the year.

I know there is still some wrestling that remains this season, but already I feel like we can stamp "successful" on this year's chapter. This year's senior class has added to the legacy.

RHS Claims 13th District 10 Championship

A string of six straight meetings between Reynolds and Fort LeBoeuf in the finals of the District 10 Class AA Team Championship Tournament was snapped as the Raiders faced a new opponent in the final round.

Saegertown advanced via a 61-9 win over Lakeview



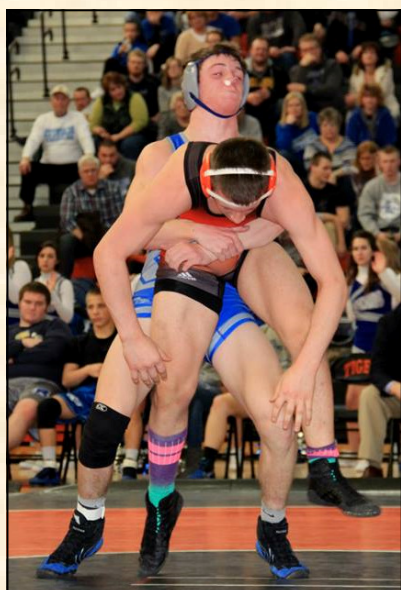

Henry Heads Back to Nationals, Lehigh's Beckman Turning Up the Heat

Jamar Henry ('13) recently battled back from injury to compete in the NJCAA Region III tournament. The injury appeared to have no ill effect on Jamar, as he decked both of his opponents to claim the 197 pound championship and — for the second consecutive year — advanced to the national tournament. Mercyhurst North East placed third in the team race.

At nationals, Jamar, who served as the Saints team captain this season, went 1-2 falling short of All-American status. He lost his first match in the championship round but bounced back for a fall in his first consolation match. He was then bumped from the tournament after losing by major decision.

Lehigh junior **Mason Beckman ('11)** appears to be peaking at right time, with the post season right around the corner.

Mason picked up technical falls against Harvard and Brown, as Lehigh battered both Ivy League foes. He then scored a 13-0 major decision against George Mason in another Lehigh romp. That match served as a wrestle-in bout for the NWCA National Duals and set the state for his most impressive win of the month, which came in the national duals quarterfinals. Beckman's riding time advantage fueled a 1-point win over fifth ranked Johnny DiJulius, helping Lehigh stun No. 3 Ohio State and advance to the semifinals. Lehigh later fell to both Missouri and Cornell to finish fourth, but Beckman picked up wins in both of those bouts to cap a perfect 4-0 event.

Up next for Lehigh is the EIWA Championships on March 6 and 7. The top three place-winners at 133 pounds will earn an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. Mason is currently ranked 10th in the country.



March 19-21, 2015

Thiel College's **Blake Heim ('12)** finished second at the recent PAC championships, helping the Tomcats claim the team title. Heim won by fall against his opponent from Waynesburg, and dropped a tough decision to Greg Kumer of W&J in the third tiebreaker period. Thiel will wrestle at the Mideast Regional tournament this weekend, where Blake will try to earn a bid to the D-III NCAA Tournament that will be held in Hershey this year on March 13 and 14.

Mercyhurst freshman **Mason McCollum ('14)** competed at the Edinboro Open where he went 0-2 dropping matches to a pair of D-I opponents from Navy and Kent State.

Levi Stoyer ('14), a freshman at Seton Hill, also competed at the Edinboro open. Levi went 1-2, picking up a major decision against Ryan Kromer of Buffalo in the opening round.

Ninth Trophy for RHS in 14 Trips to Hershey

HERSHEY, Pa.— Because each season is filled with new faces and new challenges it's true that it never does get old bringing home hardware from Hershey.

"Third in the state ... honestly, I couldn't be more proud of the kids," said Reynolds Coach Casey Taylor. "I know everybody wants to be No. 1 and that's the goal every year, but, I am really happy with the way they wrestled down here in finishing off the dual meet portion of the schedule. I think it's going to spring-board us in to the (individual) post-season."



In the opening round on Thursday, senior Ryan Zeronas (195) broke open a tie match with an overtime fall helping carry Reynolds to a 38-20 win over Saucon Valley.

The Raiders returned to the Giant Center Friday morning and looked sharp, handling District 6 champion West Branch by a 49-16 count.

In the state semifinals Friday night, the Raiders

lost their only match of the tournament, 32-27, to eventual state champion Boiling Springs. Although the loss was bitter, the Raiders bounced back very well on Saturday.

First, they disposed of Saucon Valley, which had battled back through the consolation bracket, by a 33-25 count before wrestling one of their best matches of the season in dominating Wyalusing 44-20 in the consolation finals for third place.

The second win over Saucon Valley was significant on an individual basis as junior heavyweight Gene Ringer joined the 100-win club with a first-period fall. Ringer becomes the 36th Raider to win 100 matches and joins his brother Will, who won 129 matches at RHS.

Overall, the Raiders were 4-1 in Hershey and finished the season with a 23-4 record in all dual matches wrestled.

"This year we have really focused on 'It has to be 14 guys doing the job,' and the kids really did that down here. Again, just really proud of this group—and especially happy for the seniors," Taylor said.

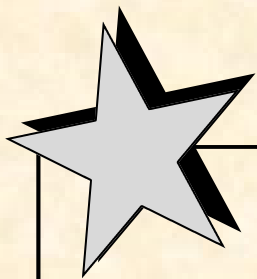

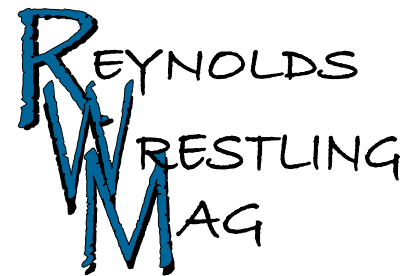
We've asked Brian Hills to join in the fun and he has agreed, so Chuck, Brian and I have begun to lay the ground work on what an event like this could look like.

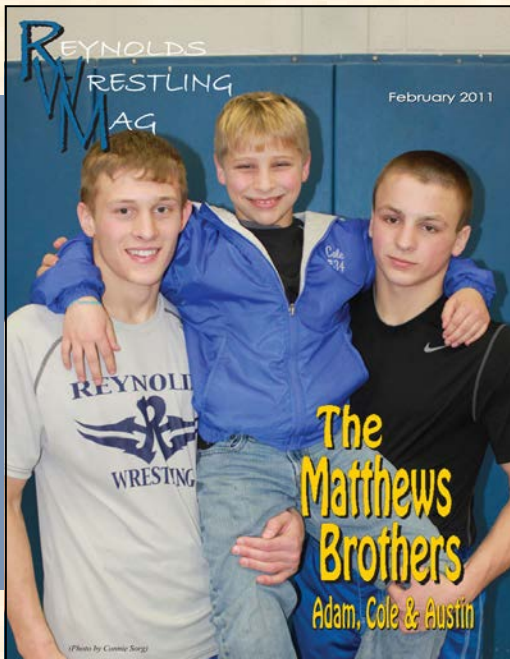

State Champs!

Matthews Wins His First Title, Raiders Win Their 10th

HERSHEY—Freshman Cole Matthews became the 25th state champion in Reynolds High School history and the Raiders earned the 2015 PIAA Class AA team points championship based on their rock-solid performance over a three-day stretch at the state wrestling championships.

It was the seventh team points title for the Raiders and the first since 2007. Other team points titles came in 1976, 1993, 1998, 2005, 2006 and 2007. Counting the three dual-match state titles, Reynolds has now won 10 PIAA Class AA state championships.

Matthews led the way by earning the 120-pound

state title. He is just the third Raider to win a state title as a freshman joining Justin Nestor (1998) and Matt Dunn (2003).

While Matthews was the lone titlist, he did not lead the Raiders to a team title alone - as six other Raiders also took part in the state tournament and all chipped in with wins including four other place-winners.

Junior Seth Hogue (126) advanced to the state finals before placing second to claim his second state medal, and Mike Bartolo (132) wrestled extremely well losing his only bout to the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler, 3-2, in the semifinals. Bartolo finished third.

Junior Gene Ringer also won his second state medal

with a sixth place showing at 285 pounds, and sophomore Cole Rickert (220) snared his first PIAA medal with a solid, seventh-place showing.

Senior Mike Millero (170) won a pair of matches and just missed placing while sophomore Gage Bayless (113) went 1-2 but contributed key points by winning his only match by fall.

Matthews was the talk of the tournament Friday morning with one of the most amazing finishes to a PIAA match you'll ever see. Matthews trailed 3-1 as the wrestlers went out of bounds with 12 seconds remaining. When action resumed, Matthews hit a standing cement mixer and gained a win by fall at the 5:54 mark.

He went on to win close decisions in the semifinals and finals to wrap-up his freshman campaign with an overall record of 43-6.

Hogue wrestled an outstanding tournament and in his state finals scored a reversal with 30 seconds remaining to take a 4-3 lead. However, he was hit with a Peterson Roll in the closing seconds of the match and dropped a heart-breaking 8-4 decision.

Bartolo, too, wrestled like a champion. He was very sharp in all of his bouts, even his semifinal loss. Bartolo finished the tournament with two -straight wins and a bronze medal.

Reynolds will return four state medalists next season, including a champion and a runner-up, and will have five returning qualifiers.

Beckman Earns D-I All-American Status for Second Time

By securing a second place finish in the EIWA Championships, **Mason Beckman ('11)** earned the right to advance to the NCAA Division I National Championships for a third time.

Beckman used a pair of falls - including one in just 14 seconds— and a decision to advance to the EIWA finals. Those two falls earned Mason the Sheridan Trophy, which is awarded to the wrestler who secures the most falls in the championship bracket in the least amount of time.

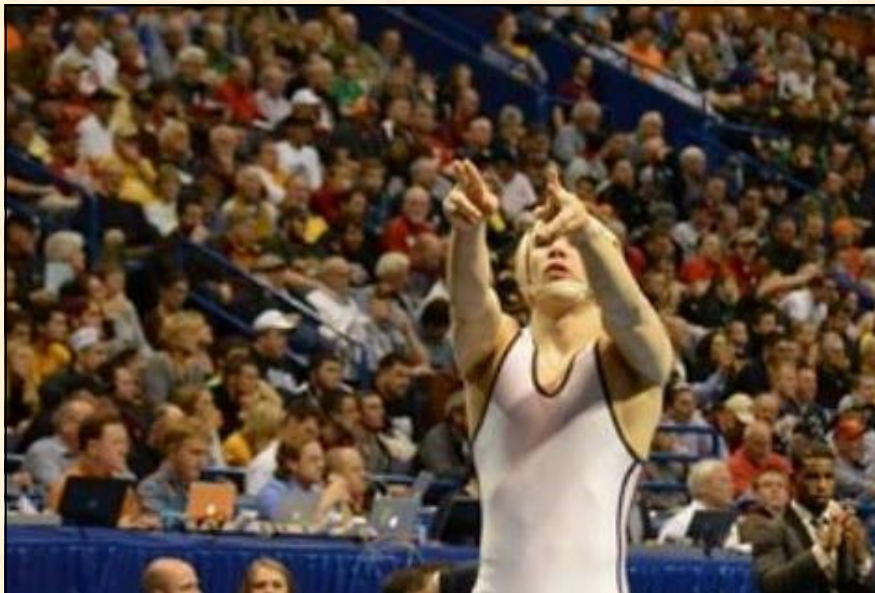
In the finals, Beckman, who was a 2014 EIWA champion, battled Drexel's Kevin Devoy to a 7-7 tie after 11 minutes of wrestling. But it was Devoy who was named the winner, as he was able to secure a 10-second advantage in riding time.

Mason entered the NCAA tournament as the 10th seed, but he got off to a disappointing start as he dropped his opening round match to Utah Valley's Jade Rauser. From there, Mason showed a lot of character and determination, as he rattled off five straight victories to earn All American honors for a second straight season.

Included in those victories were wins over the 16th seed Mackenzie McGuire of Kent State by major decision, 6th seed Earl Hall of Iowa State, and an impressive pin of 2nd seeded Ryan Taylor of Wisconsin.

Mason then dropped a 5-3 decision to the No. 1 seed, Christopher Dardanes of Minnesota to place him in the consolation finals for 5th place. There, he dropped an exciting bout to Penn State's Jimmy Gulibon to finish 6th for the second consecutive season. His final season record was 35-11 and his career record is now 85-25.

Beckman is sure to enter his senior



year among the favorites to contend for a national title. He'll also have a chance to match Raider legend **Mark Bodo ('93)**, who was a three-time all American for the University of Pittsburgh. Mark, who placed 6th, 4th and 6th at the NCAA's, was recently inducted into the PWCA Hall of Fame.

Meanwhile, **Blake Heim ('12)** concluded his junior season at Thiel College with a 15-5 record. At the Mid-East Regional tournament a bye and a decision sent Blake to the quarterfinals, where he dropped a tough overtime decision to Greg Kumer of Waynesburg. Heim then lost again in the consolations to end his season.





RHS Earns Northwest Regional Championship

SHARON — Another weekend of post-season wrestling, another team championship for the Reynolds Raiders who crowned three individual titlists en route to the 2015 Class AA Northwest Regional team points title.

Sophomore Cole Rickert (220) won his second straight NWR title while junior Seth Hogue (126) and senior Mike Millero (170) were the Raiders' other champs.

Reynolds tallied 135 points to win the team trophy. Saegertown (112) finished second, Brookville (98.5) was third, Greenville (98) was fourth and Redbank Valley (62) finished fifth.

In all, Reynolds qualified seven wrestlers for the PIAA Championships as Cole Matthews (120) finished second, and Gage Bayless (113), Mike Bartolo (132) and Gene Ringer (285) were third.

Reynolds' other Regional qualifiers—Chaise Hauck (138) and Joel Leise (152) - both came up one win short of advancing to states.

Hauck, who wrestled up two weight classes from his normal spot at 126 (when Hogue and Bartolo dropped for the post season) finished up an impressive run in the tournament trail with three wins at Regionals. His final loss came in the ultimate tiebreaker period.

Leise, after missing the bulk of the season with an injury, also made a strong postseason run. He fell behind 5-0 in his state-qualifying match before battling back in a 5-3 loss.

Hogue Named Region I Wrestler of the Year



State runner-up Seth Hogue has been named the 2015 District 10, Region I Wrestler of the Year and is one of seven Reynolds Raiders honored as first-team selections. The all-star team is voted on by Region I coaches.

In addition to Hogue (126), also named to the first team were Gage Bayless (113), Cole Matthews (120), Mike Bartolo (132), Mike Millero (170), Cole Rickert (220) and Gene Ringer (285). Reynolds had no representatives on the second team.

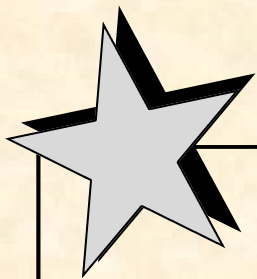
